The Order of Christian Initiation of Adults
(OCIA)

OCIA is the period of formation and conversion for one to fully enter into the faith and life of the Catholic church. This journey is intentionally designed with multiple stages and liturgical rites, with no set time to complete any of them - each faith journey is unique! With that said however, we do offer a “typical” schedule which is detailed below for 2024-2025.

1st Stage: Inquiry

Inquiry is the first stage in the journey which begins when, prompted by the Holy Spirit, an individual reaches out to learn more about Jesus Christ and His church. This will look different for everyone, and various opportunities are offered to meet everyone right where they are.

2nd Stage: Pre-Catechumenate

Following Inquiry, and having discerned the call to continue the journey, the pre-catechumenate is a period of 4 weeks which prepares you to celebrate the Rite of Acceptance and Welcome. A Catholic sponsor is chosen to journey with you. We meet on Sunday's from 9:30 to 11:00 in the lower level of the church, room B1

The Rite of Acceptance and Welcome

The Rite of Acceptance is the threshold Rite of the OCIA. In this Rite a change of identity takes place; those previously identified as "inquirers" become "catechumens" or "candidates" if already baptized. They are officially welcomed by the church as members (albeit not yet full members) of the household of faith, and are marked with the cross of Christ as God's own.

While no final commitment to enter the Catholic Church is yet made, the clear intention is to continue .

3rd Stage: The Catechumenate

The catechumenate is the second and often the longest stage, in the journey into the Catholic church. We now begin each Sunday morning by attending 9:30 Mass.

Dismissed following the homily, we gather again to reflect on Scripture, share in fellowship and learn about the beliefs, practices, doctrines and devotions of Catholicism.

The Rite of Sending

The Rite of Sending involves "sending" the Catechumens to the Bishop for "election." Their names are written in the "Book of the Elect" which will be presented to and signed by the Bishop during the Rite of Election. This Rite also allows the godparents, as well as the parish as a whole, to express their approval and assure the Catechumens of their continued care, prayer and support.

The Rite of Election

The Rite of Election marks the beginning of the final and prayerful period of preparation to receive the sacraments of initiation at the Easter Vigil. This step is called "election" because the acceptance made by the Church, through the Bishop, is founded on each catechumen's first election by God, in whose name the Church acts. The Catechumens now become the "Elect."

4th Stage: Purification and Enlightenment

Purification and Enlightenment is the third stage of the Order of Christian Initiation. This period aligns with the penitential season of Lent and includes opportunities for prayer and spiritual strengthening to prepare the Elect to receive the sacraments. We attend 9:30 Mass followed by a time of hospitality, prayer and reflection. The beautiful liturgies of Holy Week lead to the joy of the Easter Vigil.
